

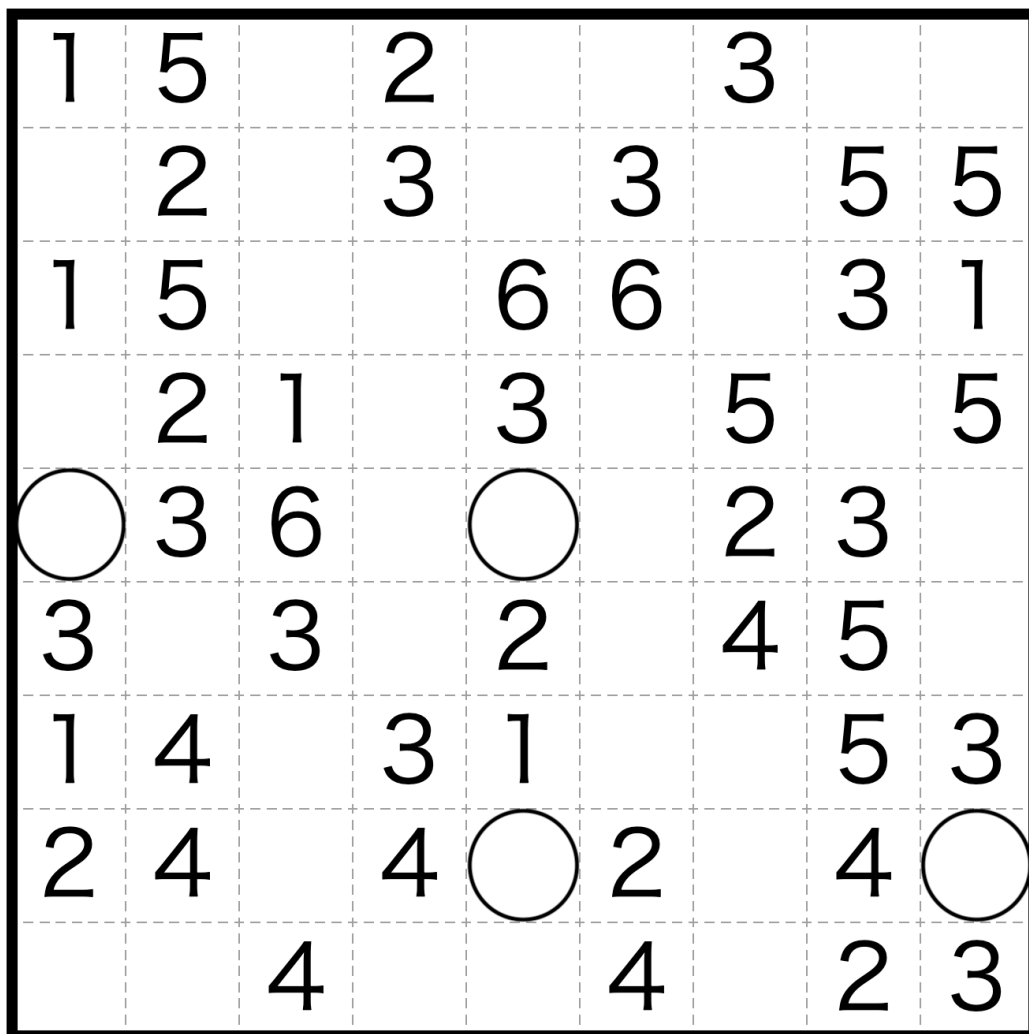

Although Sudoku is the most popular of [Nikoli's](#) offerings, they also publish other puzzle types that bridge the gap between pure logic and number sense.

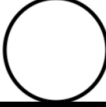

Fillomino

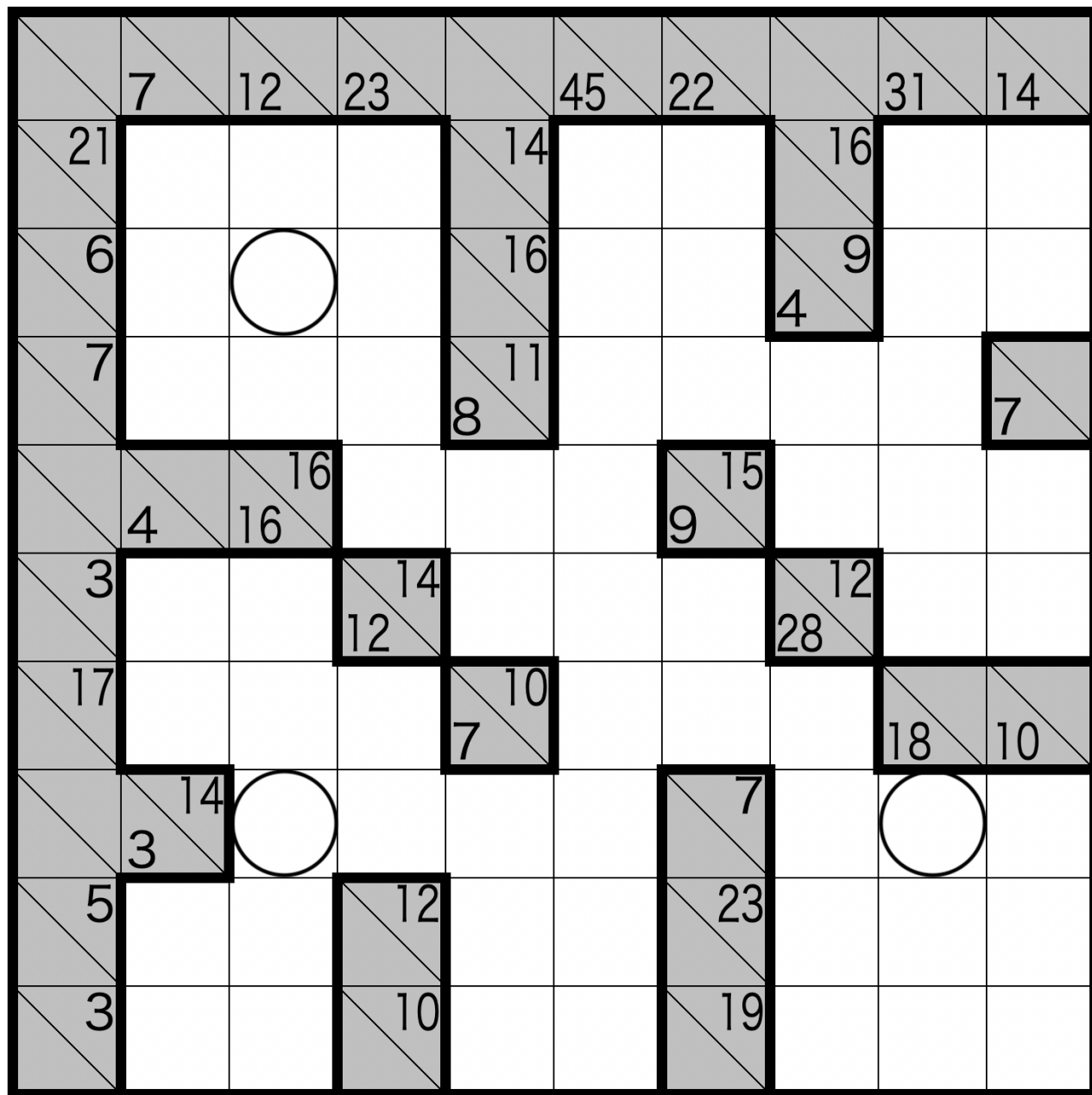


A Japanese puzzle publisher and "Godfather of the Sudoku," Maki Kaji dedicated his life to sharing the joy of puzzles. Born in Sapporo, Maki started Japan's first puzzle magazine in 1980 after dropping out of university. After stumbling upon and loving the Number Place puzzle in the mid-1980s, he put his own grids in his magazine and called it Sudoku, which roughly translates to "single numbers".
